Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back and a happy New Year to everyone.

*Our topic this half term is Knights and Princesses. The children will be focusing on knights, the Royal Family but also finding out about the Victorians with a focus on toys from the past. They will also have the opportunity to design and make their own toy and begin to think about the use of materials and properties. In Geography, the children will be exploring maps and local features using various maps, including aerial images. Please help your child with the topic by talking to them about their learning and helping them to think of questions they would like to have answered.

*Reminder- KS1 (Classes 4,5 & 6) Our school day starts at 8.55am and children need collecting promptly at 2.55pm. Please ensure that your child is with an adult until they enter the school building.

*KS1 classes have PE on the following days- Tuesday Class 6

*Whilst the weather is cold and wintry, please make sure your child is dressed appropriately. We encourage the children to wear hats, gloves and scarves and girls need to wear sensible footwear. Please ensure you place your child's name in their belongings.

*Please continue to check your child for headlice on a weekly basis to ensure that an infestation does not occur.

*A reminder that the KS1 (Class 4, 5 and 6) library is on every Wednesday in 'The Limehouse' (opposite the Nursery). It is open at 3.00pm. Thank you to everyone who has already visited and we would like to see more of you enjoying our lovely books.

* How you can help your child

Continue to read with your child and return reading packs and books each week.

Visit the KS1 library on Wednesdays.

Help your child to write the letters of the alphabet to help them be alphabet secure and to help improve handwriting.

Help your child to practice their weekly spellings or writing their full name, whichever is appropriate.

Encourage any opportunities for writing, lists, cards, stories e.t.c
