



Limehurst Primary School Pupil Premium Breakdown: 2017-2018 Allocated Funding: £14,786

At Limehurst Primary School we are committed to providing all our children with the opportunity to discover and enhance their physical talents as well as giving them the chance to have experiences that they would not normally have during their daily curriculum teaching. In 2017-2018, we will continue to use our Sports Premium more strategically and have again contracted a Sports Coach. This has enabled us to improve our sports provision, upskill staff in order to improve our long-term PE teaching and provide extra-curricular sporting opportunities for children across the school.
